Provide explanation of differences between proposed course and existing system catalog courses below:

The existing social science content course, ELED 361: Social Science For Elementary Teachers, is a non-methods course that presents major concepts and theories in the various social studies disciplines including geography, anthropology, sociology, world and US history, government, citizenship, and economics. It builds an understanding of research and inquiry in social studies specific to working with K-8 students. While ELED 361 exists within the existing system catalog, ELED 420/520 would be offered as a dual-listed course through HyFlex modality to allow in-service teachers to enroll in the course and enhance their social science content and curricular knowledge. This unique course, ELED 420/520, focuses on expanding pre-service and in-service teachers' social science content knowledge, including topics within US history, world history, geography, government and civics, and economics, through development of critical thinking skills and integration of real-world experiences instead of teaching the content as stand-alone concepts.
