The BHSU course POLS 319 is more directed toward getting students involved in democratic activism, whereas the POLS 208 course is more a theoretical approach to what it means to be a citizen in a democracy.

The BHSU course POLS/HIST 376 is based in democratic theory with a heavy focus on decolonization, especially after World War II, where the POLS 208 course is more narrowly tailored toward the subject of citizenship and doesn't deal with the subject of democratization.
