



## NSU Center for Statewide E-learning 2024-25 High School Registration Information

All registrations should be made on the South Dakota Center for Virtual Education site:  
<https://sdcve.k12.sd.us/>

**Priority registration opens at 8 a.m. April 1, 2024, and runs to 5 p.m. Friday, April 5, 2024.** All registrations during this period will be accepted into courses or put on waiting lists based on district DOE sparsity rankings.

**After 5 p.m. on Friday April 5, 2024,** all registrations will be accepted into courses or put on waiting lists on a first-come, first-served basis until courses are full.

### **To register students:**

- Students must be at least 13 years of age by the start of class.
- Select the courses you want from the included list. Note: each course SYN number is listed.
- Go to the SDCVE site, search for the appropriate SYN number, and register students.
- Times listed are Central times. Courses are one year unless otherwise noted.

**Low-enrolled classes may be cancelled.**

**Classes begin August 21, 2024, and end May 15, 2025.** All courses are tuition-free to school districts.

### **Three Methods of Delivery**

- 1) DDN:** DDN classes meet five days a week via DDN. A DDN course meets at a predetermined time with direct engagement between the teacher and the students on a daily basis. These synchronous classes typically connect students from several schools.
- 2) Blended:** A blended course features the convenience of an online course and the engagement of a DDN course. A typical week features two recorded class sessions, two live connections with the teacher and a work day. Schools schedule the course at a time that fits the school's local schedule. The DDN connections are between the teacher and the school, on the school's local schedule. Schools with a low number of students in a blended class may need to consolidate sessions depending on staffing availability.
- 3) Online:** An online course features the convenience of allowing a student to interact with the course work at a time determined by the student and the local school. Students view recorded class sessions, interacting with the content asynchronously. All class sessions and materials are available online. The course follows a traditional school calendar.
