An eclectic group of sixth-graders arrives at the 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, each eager to win for very different reasons. Sweet and shy Olive brings only her best friend (the dictionary) with her to the bee; bold and hyperallergic speller William Barfee uses his “magic foot” to propel him to greatness; former champion Chip is struggling with his burgeoning puberty; easily distracted Leaf is unconvinced that he’s smart enough to be a challenger; overachiever Marcy is disappointed by her consistent success; and politically aware Logainne Schwartzandgrubenierre only wants to impress her gay dads. In hilarious, touching, and catchy songs, each speller reveals his/her hopes, struggles, and passions as they make their way through the competition. With an engaging, tuneful score by William Finn and a sweet, funny book by Rachel Sheinkin, *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee* causes audiences to fall in love, both with the show itself and its “perspicacious,” “jocular,” and “effervescent” spellers.

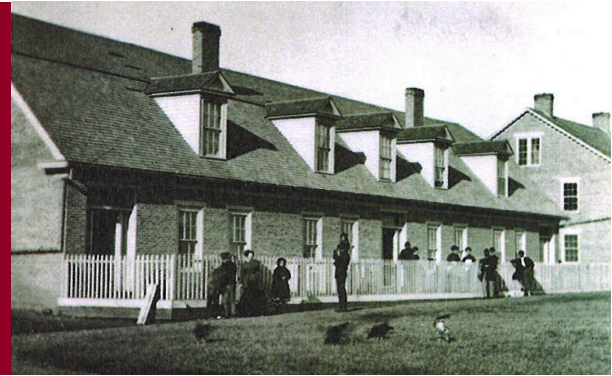

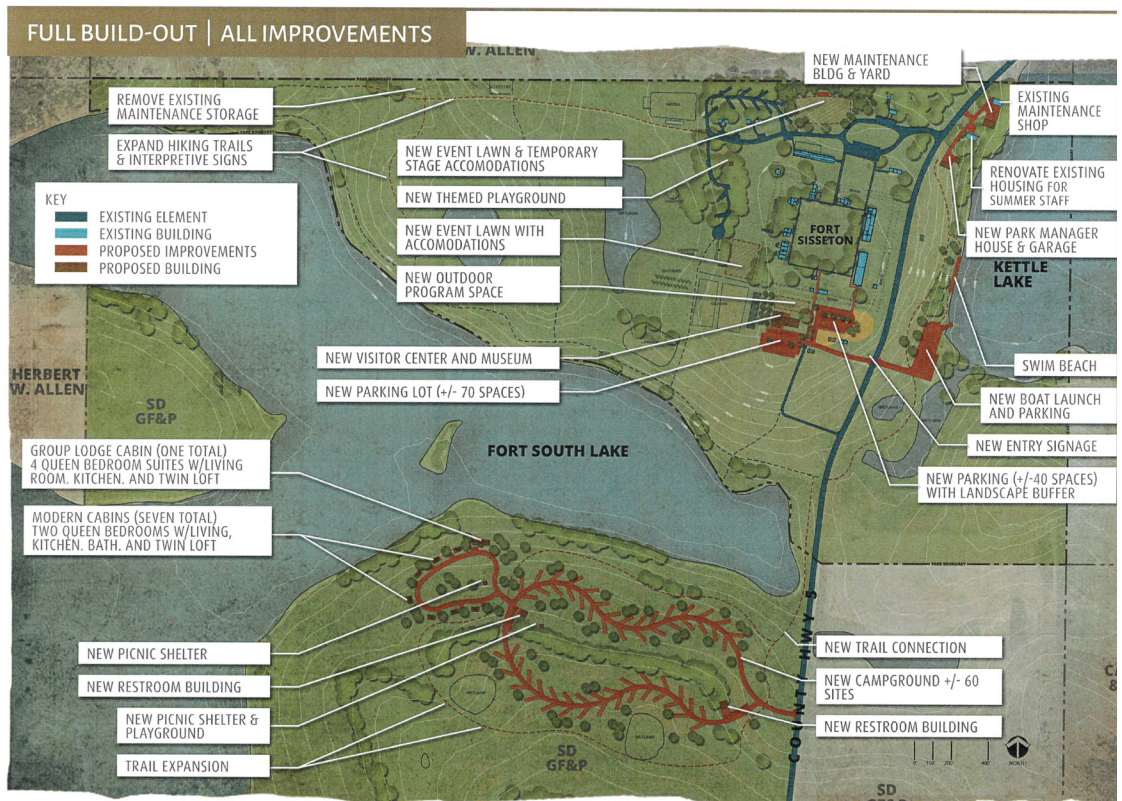

Historic Fort Sisseton Celebrates Milestone Anniversary with the Unveiling of a New Master Plan.

The Fort Sisseton Commission, appointed by the governor, has collaborated with the South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks to develop a comprehensive plan aimed at preserving the historic fort and surrounding area, while also enhancing the visitor experience. The recently unveiled \$22 million plan spans over the next decade and beyond and includes a range of initiatives to make the site a truly unique and diverse destination for visitors. The plan not only focuses on preserving the fort's rich history, but also on creating new opportunities for recreational activities, education, and community engagement. The Fort Sisseton Commission invites all stakeholders to join them in this important effort to protect and enhance this iconic park for future generations.

Late last year, the commission unveiled its master plan for the preservation of the Fort while still adding new amenities. The plan includes the construction of a new visitor center and museum on the south side of the property. This modern workspace and classrooms will



house artifact collection and protection and updated exhibits, allowing for the expansion of displays to include a more diverse history. Additionally, the plan calls for an event stage for concerts, programs, and weddings and a themed playground. The commission aims to tackle these goals in the next three to five years. The Fort Commissioners have acknowledged the ambitious nature of the Fort Sisseton Master Plan and the significant funding required to bring it to fruition. The plan is estimated to cost around \$5.7 million over the next three to five years, with the state expected to contribute a significant portion. However, the commission is aware that a substantial amount of fundraising

will also need to be done. To that end, the group has announced that they will be launching fundraising efforts and events soon.
