This course is an introduction to US environmental laws and policy. Students will examine a variety of environmental laws at the state and federal level, learn how policies are made, how they change over time, and the role of outside parties and government agencies in making policy. Students will explore the role of the public in decision making and learn how natural resource managers maintain compliance with projects that fall under federal jurisdiction.

Provide explanation of differences between proposed course and existing system catalog courses below:

The focus of AGEC 462 is on environmental law as it relates to agriculture, and AGEC 479 covers environmental policy as it relates to agriculture and food. The focus of NSU's course is on general environmental policy, looking at its history, how laws are established, and the role of government and the public in shaping environmental policy.

Based on the course description, POLS/CJUS 407 is an upper-level course that appears to focus more on legislation and political maneuvering, whereas BIOL 212 is an introductory course offering a broad overview of environmental law. Instead of focusing on the politics of environmental policy, our course will rely more on the role of the public in decision making and how natural resource managers maintain compliance with projects that fall under federal jurisdiction.
