This course examines the criminal justice process from arrest through appeal, including constitutional safeguards, pretrial proceedings, trial, and sentencing. Students explore appellate review, including conditions under which decisions may be reversed or remanded, and analyze procedural fairness, legal strategies, and reform initiatives. Additional topics include law enforcement, prosecutorial, defense, judicial roles, ethical considerations, and public policy implications. Analysis of real-world cases illustrate interactions among legal actors and impact on defendants, victims, and society.

CJUS 312 – Criminal Case Processing examines the criminal justice sequence from arrest through appeal, incorporating constitutional safeguards, pretrial proceedings, trial, sentencing, and appellate review. CJUS 412 – Criminal Prosecution and Defense focuses on the adversarial roles and strategies of prosecutors and defense counsel. CJUS 433 – Criminal Procedure focuses on constitutional requirements and case law governing enforcement and judicial practices. CJUS 312 differs from CJUS 412 and CJUS 433 by integrating arrest, pretrial, trial, sentencing, and appellate processes into a single framework, while also exploring and emphasizing the social-interactional dynamics that shape outcomes for defendants, victims, and society.
