Course Description

Required of all English majors during the fall of their sophomore year. Prepares students for their career path by examining internship opportunities, careers options, and graduate level study options available to English majors. Students will begin developing their resume/curriculum vitae and their English program portfolio. A brief exploration of the major is provided, including literary periods, creative writing genres, types of professional writing, writing for media, rhetorical studies, and composition studies. Pre-requisite: ENGL 284.

DO: Address the content of the course and write descriptions using active verbs (e.g., explore, learn, develop, etc.). There are no comparable ENGL common courses in the system. The closest course matches in the common course catalog are the unique courses ENGL 150 and ENGL 151.

ENGL 150 is currently listed as inactive. It is an introduction to the English discipline, focusing solely on fundamental concepts of literary analysis, critical theory, and digital media. ENGL 151 focuses on reading critically and writing analytically about literary texts, looking at research methods and MLA documentation style.

Conversely, our proposed course will consider all facets of the English major at NSU (literature, creative writing, professional writing, media writing, rhetoric, and composition) while focusing on options for the English major post-graduation and career readiness.



Justification for changes indicated in Section 2:

Proposing new course. ENGL 488 was intended to provide an overview of literary studies to prepare senior majors for the English exit exam. In fall 2022, we stopped requiring the exit exam and replaced it with our long-standing English Program Portfolio Review, which provides a more accurate assessment of student success and program effectiveness. As a result, we no longer need ENGL 488.
