Emphasizes the professional nurse as a leader and manager of care in the healthcare system and in society. Examines leadership, management and change theories and applies them to nursing practice. Previous knowledge is synthesized and content on conflict management, group process, fiduciary responsibility, and developing a personal leadership style are included. Co-requisites: NURS 458 and NURS 459. Pre-requisites: NURS 238, NURS 239/L, NURS 269/L, NURS 327, NURS 328, NURS 329/L, NURS 333, NURS 355, NURS 369, NURS 378, and NURS 379/L.
