Using a public health perspective, this course emphasizes epidemiology, population-based assessment tools, and the nursing process to design care for populations. Co-requisites: NURS 479L, NURS 489, and NURS 495. Pre-requisites: NURS 238, NURS 239/L, NURS 269/L, NURS 327, NURS 328, NURS 329/L, NURS 333, NURS 355, NURS 369, NURS 378, NURS 379/L, NURS 458, NURS 459, and NURS 467.

NURS 479L Course Description
Experiential learning opportunities in the community setting. Co-requisite: NURS 479
