Course Description
Examines the intersection of U.S. immigration and criminal justice systems. Traces how race, class, and national security shape policies regarding belonging and threat. Analyzes punitive enforcement, including detention and surveillance, as mechanisms of social control. Investigates consequences for individuals and communities while evaluating implications for human rights and democratic inclusion. Uses sociological perspectives to explore how these systems redefine notions of citizenship and justice.

CJUS 480 examines legal jurisdiction and crime within tribal nations. This course instead analyzes federal regulation of international movement and the legal status of non-citizens. CJUS 452 evaluates the history of domestic incarceration. This course investigates administrative systems of detention and the specific process of deportation. It focuses on the border as a mechanism of social control.
