Course Description

CTE 400/500 explores the historical evolution, guiding philosophies, and contemporary issues impacting Career and Technical Education (CTE) at secondary and post-secondary levels. Through a systems perspective, students critically examine the influence of social, political, and economic forces on CTE development, including the effects of landmark legislation such as the Smith-Hughes Act and the Perkins Act. Topics include workforce alignment, diversity and inclusion, globalization, and innovation in CTE delivery models.

3.3. Proposed instructional method by university (as defined by <u>AAC Guideline 2.4.3.A</u>): Please provide a brief description of how the course is appropriate for the instructional method, as defined in AAC Guidelines.

The proposed instructional method is Lecture (R). CTE 400/500 is appropriately delivered in a lecture format because the course content is grounded in facts, principles, ideas, and theory related to the history, philosophy, and current issues in Career and Technical Education. The learning environment is highly structured, with the faculty member formally presenting key developments such as landmark legislation (e.g., the Smith-Hughes Act, the Perkins Act), philosophical foundations, and contemporary challenges that shape CTE at the secondary and post-secondary levels.

Given that many students enter the course with limited prior knowledge of CTE's historical evolution or systemic influences, the lecture format allows for clear, straightforward communication of foundational content. This one-way dissemination of information ensures students first gain a strong baseline understanding before engaging in higher-level critical analysis. The format also accommodates varying enrollment sizes, making it suitable for both undergraduate and graduate students enrolled in the dual-level course.
