POLS 423 covers governance structures, board–staff relations, and administrative needs of nonprofit organizations. It is governance-centric and managerial in orientation, with limited attention to the social service mission, community impact, or sociological analysis of social needs. It does not examine nonprofits as social institutions embedded in inequality or community systems.

LMNO 201 introduces nonprofit organizations, leadership, and management concepts. It emphasizes leadership development and career preparation within nonprofit management; it does not focus on social services, community partnerships, and how nonprofits interact with social needs and inequality.
