I. Parties

The parties to this agreement are Northern State University (NSU) Aberdeen, South Dakota and Northeast Iowa Community College (NICC), Calmar/Peosta, Iowa.

II. Purpose

The purpose of this agreement is to:

- A. Have a signed articulation agreement that addresses the varying needs of students and complementary nature of the institutions' programs;
- B. Extend and clarify educational opportunities for students; and
- C. Provide NICC students who have completed the A.A. degree in Business Administration an opportunity to earn a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in Accounting, Banking and Financial Services, Business Administration, Economics, Finance, Management, Management Information Systems, or Marketing.

III. Academic Program

Graduation Requirements for the BS in Business Administration at NSU:

General Education from NICC 40 credits
Major Core & Major electives from NICC 20 credits

Additional General Education from NSU 2 credits
Additional Business Core from NSU 25 credits

A. Upon successful completion of the AA degree in Business Administration from NICC, with major requirements specified in III.B, below, NSU will accept 60 credits from NICC toward the 120 credit bachelor degree at NSU. BOR Policy 2.5.12 states: "Total transfer credit for work at a junior,

community college (2 year), and/or two-year technical college may not exceed one-half of the hours required for completion of the baccalaureate degree at the accepting institution." For NSU degrees requiring a minimum of 120 credits, that number is 60 credits. Students must meet all Board of Regents policies and university graduation requirements in order to receive a degree. Depending on the courses selected, students may have some extra credits.

Additional requirements:

- 1. Students transferring from NICC must have a cumulative GPA of "C" (2.0 on a 4.0 scale).
- 2. In accordance with BOR policy 2:28 students must demonstrate satisfactory performance in writing, mathematics, reading and science reasoning as evidenced by receiving a passing score on all sections of the Collegiate Assessment of Academic Proficiency (CAAP) exam. The exam must be taken during the first semester of enrollment at NSU.
- 3. Students must take the Exit Exam prior to graduation.
- 4. Students must achieve a minimum major, institutional and cumulative GPA of 2.0 for graduation.

IV. Obligations.

Both parties agree to confer with each other on a regular basis regarding changes in curricula involved in this articulation agreement.

V. Modifications

This agreement may be modified from time to time by Northern State University and Northeast Iowa Community College with approval by the South Dakota Board of Regents. Modifications may not diminish the entitlements enjoyed by students who have already attended classes delivered under the terms of earlier versions of the agreement, except in rare instances in which retroactive implementation of modifications may be required to comply with accreditation standards or to conform to professional licensure requirements.

VI. Effective Date of Agreement

This agreement will go into effect at the start of the Fall 2014 semester term at Northeast Iowa Community College and NSU. The agreement applies to students who graduated from Northeast Iowa Community College in 2007 and subsequent years.

This agreement will be renewed each year unless either party notifies the other in writing of their desire to terminate the agreement.
