Course Description
<p>This course explores cultural discourses regarding gender, sex, sexuality, and sexual behaviors. Topics will include sexual and psychosexual development, sexual health and disease, sexual variations (including atypical sexual relationships), sexual dysfunction and therapy, gender identity, and identity politics as well as how counselors can better serve those struggling with these issues. Students will understand how socialization of a person as male or female can impede their ability to function fully in society. Students will engage in exploration of their own values and biases related to sex, gender, sexuality, sexual behaviors, gender identity, and sexual dysfunction, examining how these biases may play a role in their helping relationships.</p>
