# **Bachelors in Sociology + Master of Social Work**

#### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Bachelor of Arts in Sociology prepares individuals for entry into human services, clinical practice, outreach, and community development settings. The essential components of professional social sciences education include liberal education, professional values, core competencies, core knowledge, and role development.

The College of Arts and Sciences promotes a combination of lecture and hands-on experiences that teach students to be professional and have a passion for helping others. As such, we have built a program that sets students up for successful at the graduate level, most notably, as a Master of Social Work.

The 3 + 2 option is for students who are Sociology students who know they would like to continue their education in the Social Work realm. Students take their first three academic years at Northern, taking the prerequisite courses for the University of South Dakota's Master of Social Work program while also working to complete their Bachelors in Sociology from Northern. At the start of the third academic year at Northern, students apply into the Master of Social Work program to complete their rest of the fourth year and their fifth year in the MSW at University of South Dakota onlne or in Sioux Falls. Students are conferred a BA from Northern and MSW from University of South Dakota in five years.

#### **ACCREDITATION**

University of South Dakota MSW program is accredited by the Council on Social Work Education. Both universities are accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Schools and Colleges.
