HISTORY AND GOVERNANCE

Northern State University was established in 1901 by the South Dakota Legislature in response to the need for an institution of higher education to serve northern South Dakota. NSU is a student-centered institution, offering degrees at the associate, bachelor's, and master's level that demonstrate a commitment to academic excellence and provide global learning opportunities. The university is led by a governor-appointed Board of Regents; nine members hold six-year terms, while one student regent is appointed for a limited term.

LOCATION AND CAMPUS

Northern State University is located in Aberdeen, South Dakota, a community of over 28,000 in the northeastern corner of the state. The campus sits on 66 acres and has six residential buildings, 12 academic buildings, two auditoriums, two fitness centers and six tennis courts. NSU completed its Athletic and Recreation Fields project in 2018. This includes a competition field for the soccer team, a practice field for the football team and a pavilion between the two. Three new residence halls have opened on campus in recent years: Wolves Memorial Suites in fall 2017, and Great Plains East and Great Plains West in fall 2018. The NSU Harvey C. Jewett IV Regional Science Education Center opened in 2019. The Regional Sports Complex, home to Dacotah Bank Stadium and Koehler Hall of Fame Softball Field, opened in fall 2021. The [NSU Campus Master Plan](#) includes these recent projects, as well as more upcoming changes and additions for Northern. The Aberdeen community boasts a rural atmosphere while offering a variety of cultural activities and easy access to more metropolitan areas via a regional airport and two U.S. highways.
