7. Explanation of the Change:

A historic shift is happening in the field of educational leadership. Policymakers, families, and other constituents of PK-12 schools are increasingly holding education leaders accountable for the academic success and personal well-being of every student. It is no longer enough to manage school finances, maintain a spotless and safe building, and keep the buses running on time. Education leaders must also provide clear evidence that the children in their care are being better prepared for college, careers, and life. A significant revision of the national standards that guide preparation and practice for educational leaders in the United States led to the development of the National Educational Leadership Preparation (NELP) national standards. The NELP standards address the most critical knowledge and skill areas for beginning building-level educational leaders and provide a framework for understanding how to best prepare, support, and evaluate education leaders in their efforts to help every child grow.

The NELP standards are approved by the Council for the Accreditation for Educator Preparation (CAEP), and align with the four CAEP principles. South Dakota Legislative Rule (24:53:08:02) for professional principal preparation, states “ The required courses and experiences of a preschool through grade 12 principal program must meet the National Educational Leadership Preparation (NELP) Program Recognition standards 2018 edition.”

After completing a crosswalk between the current curriculum for Northern State University’s Master of Science in Leadership and Administration program and the multifaceted components of the NELP standards, a needs assessment determined necessary modifications to the curriculum. The revised overall program represents a synthesis of the knowledge, skills, and commitment articulated in the NELP standards. The revised curriculum provides students with more comprehensive education in the areas of:

- Instructional Leadership,
- Diversity and Inclusion, and
- Professional Staff and Student Development.

We also determined that the opportunity existed to reduce the number of credits from 35 to 32. Other Leadership and Administration programs in the state require fewer credits, and it would bode well for Northern State University to have similar requirements. The revised curriculum, though fewer credits, encompasses carefully determined coursework that is efficiently streamlined to manifest the rigorous NELP standards for performance, thus creating a more affordable, more intentional program of study for candidates.
