

Do you need to take any tests?

Based on South Dakota Board of Regents placement policies, students are enrolled in certain Math, English and Reading courses. Course numbers starting with 0 (ENGL 033, READ 041, MATH 021 and MATH 095) do not count toward graduation. ENGL-033 and READ-041 must be passed before moving on to other courses in the series. Although not required, MATH-021 and 095 may be recommended based on placement scores; however, all students have the option of beginning with MATH-101 instead.

You do not need to test:

o If you are satisfied with your placements. SEE PLACEMENT CHART

- If you take the AP Calculus exam and/or the AP Language/Comp exam and earn a score of 3 or higher, as you will be awarded credit for Math 123 Calculus and ENGL 101, Composition, respectively.
- If you have passed ENGL 033, 101, READ 041, MATH 021, 095, 101, 114 or higher math from a SD BOR university, while in high school. Placement will be based on courses passed.
- If you are transferring in an English 101 equivalent or a Math 101 or higher equivalent credit from non-BOR schools. Placement will be based on courses passed.
- The READ 041 requirement will be waived if a student has earned an associate or baccalaureate degree or has completed and transferred in the equivalent of our ENGL 101 and 201 (English composition). In these cases, the Reading placement test is not needed.

You need to test:

• If you submitted SAT scores rather than ACT scores, as you may need to take the ACCUPLACER Reading test to determine proper placement into Reading courses. No fee is charged for these initial assessments.

- If you are 24 years old or older and do not have ACT or SAT scores taken within the last 5 years, or do not have a high school gpa no more than 5 years old, take ACCUPLACER Writing, Reading and Math tests. No fee is charged.
- \circ If you wish to challenge your placement. A small fee is charged per exam. For Reading and English, the ACCUPLACER exam is used. For Math, the Challenge Index is used (CI- 290x HSGPA = AAF + 20). Your HSGPA must be greater than 2.861 to improve your placement to MATH 103 or 114.

Testing should be considered for the following scenarios:

- If you place into ENGL 033, READ 041 or MATH 101 and have enrolled in math, English, or reading courses since testing, you may choose to challenge your placement by taking the ACCUPLACER test in applicable areas. A small fee is charged per exam.
- If you have a Math Index score of 1300 or higher (MI = 250 x HSGPA + 17 x MATH ACT) or a High School GPA of 3.55 or higher, you may choose to take the Math ACCUPLACER Calculus Readiness exam to see if you can take MATH 123, Calculus instead of lower math courses for your math requirement. MATH 115 Pre-calculus, MATH 120 Trigonometry, and MATH 121 Survey of Calculus also satisfy the gen ed math requirement and may be taken

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with a math Index of 1300 or higher or HSGPA of 3.55 or higher. No fee is charged for attempting to place in MATH 123.

Placement tests are online and should be taken prior to your registration day. Please call the NSU Testing Center in advance at 605-626-2029 for details.

CHEMISTRY

Students who plan to major in the sciences and have had Chemistry in high school, may start with CHEM 112/L. Those who did not take Chemistry in high school should start with CHEM 106/L, Chemistry Survey.

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
