Specific Education Undergraduate Requirements	(d) Persons who first sit for the uniform CPA exam on or after January 1, 2016, must have completed a total of 120 semester hours or 180 quarter hours of postsecondary education, including a baccalaureate degree at a college or university accredited by a regional accreditation board such as the Southern Association of Colleges and Universities, with a concentration in accounting or the substantial equivalent as determined by the board. The candidate shall be determined to have a concentration in accounting or its substantial equivalent upon presenting evidence to the Board that he or she has satisfied any one of the following: 1. The candidate shall have completed (i) at least 24 semester hours or equivalent quarter hours in accounting (excluding introductory courses) at the upper division undergraduate and/or graduate level including minimum requirements in each of the following subject areas: (I) Financial Accounting - 9 semester hours (II) Auditing - 3 semester hours (III) Taxation - 6 semester hours (IV) Management Accounting - 3 semester hours (V) Governmental and Not-For-Profit Accounting - 3 semester hours; and (ii) at least three (3) semester or equivalent quarter hours in business law, concentrating primarily on the Uniform Commercial Code; and (iii) at least 24 semester or equivalent quarter hours in business courses (other than accounting courses) at the undergraduate or graduate level from among the following subject areas: economics; legal and social environment of business; business law (in addition to the three hours required above); marketing; finance; organization, group, and individual behavior; quantitative applications in business; communication skills, and business ethics; or 2. The candidate shall have been awarded a graduate degree in accounting from a program that, as of the date of granting said degree, is accredited in accounting by the American Assembly

	of Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB), or comparable accrediting organization recognized by the Board; or 3. The candidate shall have been awarded a graduate degree from a program that, as of the date of granting said degree, is accredited in business by the AACSB, or comparable accrediting organization recognized by the Board, and completed a course of instruction that includes all of the requirements specified in 1. above.



Dear Ms. Preston,

To comply with disclosure requirements of the US Department of Education regulation §668.50(b)(7) Professional Licensure/Certification (PLC) pre-education requirements and National Council – State Authorization Reciprocal Agreements (NC-SARA), Northern State University has reviewed the pre-education requirements for Alabama Certified Public Accountant Licensing. After comparing the NSU Bachelor of Science Professional Accountancy (BSPA) curriculum with the Alabama CPA Statute(s) pre-education requirements, we have identified one course discrepancy.

Alabama requirement (IV) Management Accounting – 3 semester hours. The NSU BSPA curriculum does not require specific Management Accounting course. However, the BSPA curriculum does require two accounting courses with management content ACCT 211 and ACCT 320 sec course descriptions below.

ACCT 211 - Principles of Accounting II

A continuation of <u>ACCT 210</u> with emphasis on partnership and corporate structures, management decision-making, cost control, and other selected topics. Prerequisite: <u>ACCT 210</u> 3 credits

ACCT 320 - Cost Accounting

The study of principles and techniques for accumulating, reporting, and analyzing cost information for decision-making and external reporting. The use of cost accounting systems for planning and controlling cost responsibility centers is emphasized. Consideration is given to the appropriate use of various cost accounting methods such as activity-based costing, target costing, and just in time management techniques in service and manufacturing industries. Prerequisite: <u>ACCT 211</u> 3 credits
